**RESOLUTION 138-2024**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Mountainside (“Borough”) offers a deferred compensation plan for its employees in an attempt to attract and retain qualified employees by providing them with an opportunity to enhance their financial security at retirement through savings of compensation on a deferred basis as provided by Section 457 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (“Code”); and

WHEREAS, there is no direct financial cost to the Borough to adopt and implement an employee Deferred Compensation Plan and Service Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Police Benevolent Association (“PBA”) made written requests for proposals from Empower Retirement, LLC (“Empower”), Weinerman Wealth Management and Equitable Financial Life Insurance; and

WHEREAS, the following contractors submitted written proposals: Empower, Weinerman Wealth Management, and Equitable Financial Life Insurance; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing the proposals it was determined by the PBA that Empower has the ability to (1) maintain complete records of accounts; (2) manage accounts with absolute fidelity; (3) provide advice concerning various categories of investments; and (4) provide continuing consultation to participants; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body is unaware of any collusion, or evidence or appearance of collusion, between any local official and a representative of the contractor in the selection of the contractor as prohibited in the selection and/or administration of a Service Agreement contractor pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:37-5.7.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mountainside, County of Union, State of New Jersey, that it does hereby adopt and approve the Plan prepared by Empower and assigned Plan Document identifier 21-PD-Empower-110121 as a Deferred Compensation Plan Provider by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Glenn Mortimer, Borough Administrator be and he hereby is authorized to enter into a Service Agreement (bearing the identifier: 21-SA-Empower-110121 assigned by the New Jersey Division of Local Government) with National Life Group based upon the proposal received from National Life Group to serve as a Deferred Compensation Plan Provider for the Borough of Mountainside employees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT based upon the representation made by National Life Group it is hereby acknowledged that the Deferred Compensation Plan is substantially similar to one on which a favorable Private Letter Ruling has been previously obtained from the federal Internal Revenue Service expect for provisions added by reason of the Small Business Job Protection Act of 1996 (United States Public Law No. 104-188) and the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001 (United States Public Law No. 107-16) and all such provisions are stated in the plan in terms substantially similar to the text of those provisions in the Internal Revenue Code Section 457. The use of the Ruling is for guidance only and the Borough acknowledges that for the Internal Revenue Service purposes, the Ruling of another employer is not to be considered precedent.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:37-5.4, the Executive Director is hereby designated as the Local Plan Administrator for the administration of the Plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution and all necessary required documents shall be submitted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within the State Department of Community Affairs for approval.
