ORDINANCE 1271-2018

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$200,000 TO FUND THE PREPARATION AND EXECUTION OF A COMPLETE PROGRAM OF REVALUATION OF REAL PROPERTY IN THE BOROUGH OF MOUNTAINSIDE

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MOUNTAINSIDE, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than the majority of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. N.J.S.A. 40A:4-53 provides that a local unit such as the Borough of Mountainside, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"), may adopt an ordinance

authorizing a special emergency appropriation to fund the preparation and execution of a complete program of revaluation of real property in the Borough for the use of the Borough assessor.

SECTION 2. The Borough has determined and does hereby authorize a special emergency appropriation in an amount not to exceed \$200,000 to fund the preparation and execution of a complete program of revaluation of real property in the Borough for the use of the Borough assessor.

SECTION 3. The amount to finance the appropriation shall be provided for in succeeding annual budgets by the inclusion of at least 1/5 of the amount authorized, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-55.

SECTION 4. To finance the appropriation authorized hereunder, and described in Section 2 hereof, special emergency notes of the Borough (the "Notes") shall be authorized by a resolution of the Borough Council to be adopted in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-55.

SECTION 5. A certified copy of this ordinance as finally adopted will be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, in the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after final adoption and approval by the Mayor as described in N.J.S.A. 40:49-2.
