**PROCLAMATION:**

WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

WHEREAS, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

WHEREAS, on April 24, 2020 the Department of Public Works will observe Arbor Day by planting two trees; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor & Council, along with Beautiful Mountainside Committee and the Arbor Day Foundation are working together to bring back the beauty of the tree line to the community by applying and being approved for 825 free trees to be handed out to the residents of Mountainside.

WHEREAS, one of the qualifications for a municipality to be eligible to be designated as a Tree City U.S.A. is by having an Arbor Day Observance and Arbor Day Proclamation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mountainside hereby recognize and commend Mountainside Department of Public Works along with Beautiful Mountainside Committee, for their observance of Arbor Day and for working toward making the Borough of Mountainside a more tree-lined municipality and a more attractive place in which to live and work.

**ORDINANCE:** Second Reading (Public Hearing)

**ORDINANCE 1284-2020  
ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK**

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et.seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said final budget appropriations to 2.50% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous years' final appropriations; and,

WHEREAS, a municipality may, by ordinance, bank the difference between its final budget appropriations and the 3.5% increase authorized by this ordinance when said difference is not appropriated as part of the final budget; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Mountainside, County of Union, hereby determines that this difference in the amount of \$97,278.76 that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, that any amount authorized herein above that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

This ordinance shall be effective upon final passage and publication in accordance with the law.

**RESOLUTION 55-2020**

GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE  
UNITED STATES EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY COMMISSION'S  
"Enforcement Guidance on the Consideration of Arrest and Conviction Records in  
Employment Decisions Under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964"

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 as amended by P.L. 2017, c.183 requires the governing body of each municipality and county to certify that their local unit's hiring practices comply with the United States Equal Employment Opportunity Commission's "Enforcement Guidance on the Consideration of Arrest and Conviction Records in Employment Decisions Under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964," as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e et seq., (April 25, 2012) before submitting its approved annual budget to the Division of Local Government Services in the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have familiarized themselves with the contents of the above-referenced enforcement guidance and with their local unit's hiring practices as they pertain to the consideration of an individual's criminal history, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mountainside, hereby states that it has complied with N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5, as amended by P.L. 2017, c.183, by certifying that the local unit's hiring practices comply with the above-referenced enforcement guidance and hereby directs the Clerk to cause to be maintained and available for inspection a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to show evidence of said compliance.

**RESOLUTION 61-2020**

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE USE OF THE STORM RECOVERY TRUST FUND, PER P.L. 2013, Ch. 271 (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-62.1), FOR EXPENSES RELATED TO THE COVID-19 RESPONSE

WHEREAS, permission was granted by the Director of Local Government Services on November 20, 2012 for a Storm Recovery Trust Fund, per P.L. 2013, Ch. 271 (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-62.1).

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-62.1 permits a municipality or county to adopt a resolution authorizing storm recovery reserve funds to be used for "any purpose necessary to protect the safety, security, health, and welfare, of its citizens from the damage caused by an emergency declared by the Governor or the President of the United States."

WHEREAS, Governor Philip D. Murphy declared a State of Emergency for the State of New Jersey with Executive Order No. 103 on March 9, 2020 in response to the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, outbreak.

WHEREAS, Local Finance Notice 2020-06 of the Division of Local Government Services also advised that municipalities with a Storm Recovery Trust Fund may use those funds for the coronavirus response; and, any reimbursement of these expenditures shall be deposited back into the reserve.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Mountainside in the County of Union, New Jersey as follows:

1. The Governing Body does hereby authorize the utilization of the Storm Recovery Reserve funds for expenses incurred in relation to the coronavirus, COVID-19, response.
2. The Clerk of the Borough of Mountainside, is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Mountainside intends to enter into a purchase contract with Winner Ford, Cherry Hill, NJ pursuant to NJ State Contract #88726 for the acquisition of a police vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the cost for (1) one 2020 Ford F250 under NJ State Contract #88726 for \$29,710.00; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Financial Officer has certified that the funds are available for this purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Mountainside, County of Union State of New Jersey that the purchase of (1) one Ford F250 under the terms and provisions of NJ State Contract #88726 be and hereby are approved.
